Dear Chairman Cole and Representative DeLauro:

The Mental Health Liaison Group writes to express our strong support for full funding of the Compassionate Communication on HIPAA provisions authorized under Subtitle C, Title XI, Section 11004 of the 21st Century Cures Act. (P.L. 114-255). To enhance the quality of behavioral health and medical/surgical services, we believe it is essential that model programs and training materials be developed for health care professionals regarding permitted uses and disclosures of Protected Health Information (PHI) through HIPAA.

HIPAA regulations allow health professionals to share information with a patient's loved ones in emergency or dangerous situations. However, widespread misunderstandings to the contrary persist and create obstacles to family support that is crucial to the proper care and treatment of persons experiencing a crisis situation – such as a psychiatric episode or a drug overdose.

Pursuant to Sec. 11003 of the 21st Century Cures Act, the Office of Civil Rights – an agency within the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services – recently issued clarifying guidance explaining how health care providers have broad ability to share health information with patient's family members during certain crisis circumstances without violating HIPAA privacy regulations. Now, it is critically important that Congress follow through with funding for the training of health professionals – including physicians, nurses, emergency medical personnel, care managers and hospitals – regarding permitted HIPAA uses and disclosures.

These training materials can be widely employed to train health professionals and administrative professionals working across the healthcare system. In our view, fully funding Section 11004(2)(e)(2) of 21^{st} Century Cures can make a huge difference in the lives of patients and families facing immediate crises.
