Dear Chairman Sanders, Chairwoman Rogers, and Ranking Members Cassidy and Pallone,

On behalf of the Mental Health Liaison Group (MHLG), a coalition of national organizations representing consumers, families, mental health and addiction providers, advocates and other stakeholders committed to strengthening access to high-quality mental and behavioral health care, we write to urge the Senate HELP and House Energy and Commerce Committees to reauthorize the *Substance Use Disorder Prevention That Promotes Opioid Recovery and Treatment for Patients and Communities Act* (SUPPORT Act) within the forthcoming floor package and include the Senate HELP Committee's additional provisions to maximize the investment into substance use and co-occurring mental health programs.

In 2021, the National Survey on Drug Use and Health (NSDUH) estimated that 44 million individuals in the United States reported having a substance use disorder (SUD).<sup>1</sup> Since the 2018 passage of SUPPORT Act, 13% of Americans have reported increasing or starting substance use as a way of coping with stress related to the pandemic,<sup>2</sup> and in 2023, overdose rates topped 112,000 for the first time in history, proving the importance of meeting the ever-changing needs of the American population.<sup>3</sup> Overdose deaths among youth ages 10-19 increased 109% between 2019 and 2021, and deaths involving fentanyl increased 182%.<sup>4</sup>

However, substance use disorders and overdose do not occur in a vacuum. Up to 50% of those with substance use disorders also experience co-occurring mental health conditions,

meaning substance use disorder and mental health are deeply intertwined.<sup>5,6</sup> Best clinical practice is to integrate substance use treatment and co-occurring mental health treatment.<sup>7</sup> Policies that integrate these co-occurring conditions provide the most cost effective and successful outcomes to battle the rising rates of both substance use disorder and behavioral health conditions. It is crucial to not only reauthorize, but also update and improve upon existing programs to address the surging rates of behavioral health conditions and overdose faced by the nation.<sup>8,9</sup>

We applaud the work of both Chambers this past year and are supportive of the overlapping provisions for the SUPPORT Act reauthorization reported out by the HELP Committee and passed by the House of Representatives this past December. As the Committees work to negotiate the differing provisions between the Chambers, we urge the inclusion of the additional sections reported out by the HELP Committee to maximize the existing resources to address this surging epidemic, including the following provisions:

- **Sec. 111.** Promoting State choice in PDMP systems
- **Sec. 112.** Protecting Suicide Prevention Lifeline from cybersecurity incidents

- **Sec. 114.** Guidance on at-home drug disposal systems
- **Sec. 203.** Regional centers of excellence in substance use disorder education
- **Sec. 207.** Development and dissemination of model training programs for substance use disorder patient records
- **Sec. 108.** Preventing Adverse Childhood Experiences
- **Sec. 211.** HHS and DOL OIG review of required parity guidance to plans
- **Sec. 214.** Roundtable on using health information technology to improve mental health and substance use care outcomes
- **Sec. 215.** Peer-to-peer mental health support
- **Sec. 216.** Kid PROOF Act to provide parents with supplies to prevent overdose and suicide
- **Sec. 305.** CAREER Act to expands Ag's (RISE) grant program for rural community skills building
